SPEECH

Italy welcomes Senora Evita Peron. Rome citizens line the streets as the 27 year old ex-film star wife of Argentine's President Juan Peron continues her European tour. While in Rome she makes a number of public appearances.

In her 82 pieces of baggage Senora Peron has 200 dresses, quite apart from coats and furs. She is the first woman in South American history to share her husband's public life. When President Peron saw her off at Buenos Aires, he said "To Europe I send the heart of the Argentine." To our Rome reporter, Senora Peron speaks of her proposed visit to Britain.

The Foreign Office have announced that Evita Peron will be a most welcome visitor to Britain.
