Star-studded Glasgew Rangers kick off against Morton (the Greenock outsiders) in the Scottish Cup Pinal, played off at Eampdon Park. Eddie Rutherford, No. 7, deputising for injured intermational Willie Waddell, starts off the first attack, and only goalie Cowan's smart save prevents Rangers from secring. Instead of the predicted walk-ever, misfortume befalls the pride of Glasgew. Speeding away on the left-wing, David Cupples is fouled by Rangers' McGell.

135,000 fans rear - as Morton's Jimmy White - and the Hampden wind - place the free kick in the corner of the net.
