Kashmir celebrated the attainment of freedom from the autocratic rule of Mahereja Sir Heri Singh for one week. The Prime Minister of India Pandit Mehru also took part in the celebrations. And meanwhile Maharaja Sir Hari Singh went to Uri front to inspect the Indian Army positions.

the people seemed to enjoy the attainment of their independence.

Pandit Wehru imspected Indian Army troops as well as the Parade of Kashmir police, Militia, Women's National Guards and the Children's Corps. The most picture sque item was the river procession of Pandit Nehru.
