

ACHIEVEMENT ON WHEELS

Britain's commercial motors go on show at Harls Court. A mobile greengrocery shop - an all-electric model - which cuts out queues and makes shopping easy, is just one of the many new intriguing displays at this - the first commercial motor show for eleven years. Orders placed by overseas buyers already total more than £5 million. Much interest is shown in the hydraulic tail-board loader - a time and labour saving gadget that makes loading a one-man job. Price - £150 - cheap enough to fix one at the bottom of your staircase (if you haven't got a lift).

And here is the telescopic five-ton dust cart, which, by a hydraulic ram action, dumps its load at a controllable speed.

From 50 overseas countries, 100,000 motoring experts have come to this show. Much admired is this tipping cab. Hinged at the floor, it opens for easy access to the engine, cutting out backache and ground-crawls.

British designed engines are in greater demand than ever. Gleaming coaches for Holland, 40-seater buses for the Empire and South America, capable of doing 800-mile journeys and speeds up to 75 miles-an-hour, help to swell Britain's export drive.
