California's bumper crep of walking comes down with the wind. By blowing the leaves from the heavyladen trees, a man made hurricane (provided by a hovering helicopter) leaves giant-sized nuts clear for picking. For the walket growers of California, this year's record harvest is indeed a windfall. The helicopter - the world's handlest jack-of-all-trades - takes a unique place among modern farm machinery.
