TORNADO HITS SOUTH AFRICA

For the second time in 30 years, disaster visits the mining term of Reedepeart, 12 miles from Johannesburg on the main Gold Reef. Bursting ever the term with the fury of an atom bomb, a termade leaves a trail of havee in its path. Two square miles are devastated.

Red Cross workers are in action within hours of the tragedy. Casualty lists name seven dead, hundreds injured. Thousands made homeless, receive temperary shelter, and feed.

Survivers of this, the worst natural disaster in recent Union history, say that terrential rain came first: a hailstern followed, then the ternade. Five minutes sufficed to render the term unrecognisable.

Many recall a similar sterm which struck the term just after World War One. Gleaners search the rubble of their homes.

A Government Fund is being raised to speed the work of relief. The ternade has passed - but years of rebuilding lie ahead.
