

BRITAIN HONOURS IKE

Top-ranking personalities in Britain's Armed Services assemble at the Dorchester Hotel, London to honour a great American soldier, General Dwight Eisenhower. Famous wartime leaders present include Admiral Cunningham and Marshal Tedder. The occasion marks the publication of Eisenhower's memoirs. Also there General Horrocks, Admiral John Cunningham, General Steele and America's Admiral Connolly. Lord Tedder (who as second-in-command to General Eisenhower, was closer to him than anyone) pays tribute to the General's success in welding his many Armies into a mighty fighting unit.

In a recorded message from New York, General Eisenhower - now Chancellor of Columbia University, replies:-
