INTERNATIONAL SKI WEEK ON MONT BLANC

A very large crowd attended the ski-jumping competition in Les Bossons. There were 20 competitors there for that intrepid test. Among them were favourites: the Frenchmen Regis Charlet and Luchinni, the Swiss Tschannen.

It is the Swiss Fritz Tschannen who won the competition, jumping 65 meters high the first time and 57 meters high the second time. The Frenchman Luchini No.7 was second.

DOWNHILL RUN "MEN"

In presence of 25,000 spectators, took place the last test of the International Ski Week on Mont Blanc, in the "Houches" near Chamonix. There were about 40 competitors to run about 3,000 meters with big changes of levels. The speed was sometimes 100 kilometers one hour. The race was very dangerous and some competitors had bad falls.

It is the Frenchman Desire Lacroix (No.16), 21 years old, who won the race in 3'11", Zeno Colo (Italian) was second (No.7). Oreiller was third; that man had a terrific spill but retrieved his position and passed the finishing line.
