UNITED EUROPE IS NEAR - CHURCHILL

In London's Guildhall is honoured a man for whom no honour is too great. Winston Churchill - in the presence of men from all political parties - receives the Golden Grotius Medal, from the chairman of the Dutch United Nations Association, in recognition of his great work towards the founding of a United Europe. Named after the Dutch Internationalist Hago Grotius, the medal is given for services to international law and order and this is its first award for ten years. In his speech of thanks, Mr. Churchill refers to the rapid progress made since he first suggested a United Europe and says that Western Union is the first stepping stone towards that grand objective.
