FEVER SING BREAKS ANOTHER RECORD

The world's biggest jet-propelled aircraft - the giant American "flying wing" leaves its bessein California for a non-step flight to Washington, 22 hundred miles away. As this great tail-less bomber sweeps eastwards, its eight jets blase fantastic patterns across the skies.

The hundred ten Giant can fly at altitudes of more than 50,000 feet. This is how Ohio looks, from eight miles up. Setting up another new heavy bember record, the six-man crow brings the B-49 into Washington. Average speed 515 miles-an-hour. A British 600-mile-an-hour jet bember is expected to take the air in early summer. Until them, the record rests with America.
