### Brists1

Britain's first all-aluminium pro-fab schools - constructed to defeat the stool-shortage - are completed at Locklease Estate, Bristel, in a record nine nonths. Minister of Education, George Temlinson, accompanied by the Mayor of Bristeh, opens four of the schools which, together, will accommedate 2,000 children.

The cost works out at about £180 a place, admittedly high, says the Minister, but still comparing favourably with other types of primary schools.

### London

Antis, an Alsatian (fermer mascet of an R.A.F. Squadren) comes to Olympia, London, to collect his reward for outstanding war service. Several times wounded, and the saviour of four lives, Antis receives from Field Marshal Earl Wavell the Dickins Bronse Model, the Animal's V.G. As a puppy, he was found abandened in a French chateau by a Osech airman. His certificate of gallantry (Barl Wavell tells him) is the first over awarded to a foreign deg. ## **East Anglia**

In the Pens, the swollen River Ouse again threatens villages and farmlands. Workers reinforce the dyne bank against floods, expected when high winds and spring tides form a barrier against the river as it empties into the Wash. Bulldesers are out at Stew Bridge and Magdalen as Catchment Board engineers organise 24-hour patrols of the banks, already plugged with thousands of tens of clay. The danger to homes was increased by breaches term in the coast defences by gales a fortnight before. Shingle banks helding back the sea were swept away. Despite many willing hands, the task of refertification became impensible due to the uncovering of many sea mines.

#### London

Stoke Newington, London, and Health Minister, Ansurin Bevan, cuts the first turf of the new £187,000 Woodberry Down Health Centre, first of 162 similar centres planned. With L.C.C. President Owen, and Leader Haywood, the Minister sees a model of the centre, which brings under one roof child welfare, dental and natal clinics besides local health services. When completed, it will serve 18,000 people
