Ton Eastwood (who was due to retire six menths age) tells of his consing discovery. 3,000 feet down, his bering team find extensive coal seams, nearly eight feet thick, and estimated to yield at least 400 million tens of coal. First to inspect this great find, is the Chairman of the Nest Midland Goal Board, Sir Ben Smith.
