LOW BLOW COSTS THEMPSON HIS TITLE

Topliner at the star-studied re-opening of Lendon's Olympia is the European title-bout between Yorkshire's ourly-haired Billy Thompson on the left - and "Kid" Bussart from Belgium. A 10,000 crowd sees the nature-looking Belgian "Kid" dictate the battle from the start. Ex-miner Thompson, very much below his best, has few chances to shime.

It is in round two that the British boxer's European grown begins to topple. The Belgian sends over a well-timed right-hander, and to the fans astemishment, down goes Thompson.

Up at mine, Thompson is obviously dated and can't hold off the swings and hooks of the enrushing Belgian. Two murderous "left-rights" to the head - a glamming left swing - and Thompson is down against

Outbomed and outgeneralled, only Thompson's fighting heart - and the bell - save him from further punishment.

And that's how it goes all the way - with Dussart piling up a olear points lead. The end comes in round six, when in a clinch, Thompson hits his opponent below the belt. Having been warned earlier, he is immediately disqualified. Doubled up in pain is the new European lightweight champion - "Kid" Dussart.

For unlusty Milly Thompson, the road to world fame must begin all over again.
