MINIATURE WAR STAGED FOR KING ABDULLAH

Here at the Government's invitation, King Abdullah of Trans-Jordan visits the Army School of Infantry at Warminster, on the Wiltshire Downs. With him is Glubb Pasha, legendary British Arab Legion Commander. Others in a distinguished party are the young Prince Naif and, new to the English climate, the Trans-Jordan Defence Minister. The foreign visitors take a good look at the Army's new experimental combat suit, now under test in battle conditions. Eighth Army men hold the compromising opinion that it looks too much like the get-up of Rommel's Afrika Korps.

High-spot of the inspection is a full-scale infantry attack, with live ammunition, tanks and flame-throwers.

Prince George of Greece is there as military attache, with Arab Legion onlookers.
