## 8000 MERT UP - AND THEY AREN'T DIEST

Right thousand feet up in the Bavarian Alps, they do more than yedel. Acrobats send cold shivers down enlockers spines as they go for a walk on a wire. The lew temperature adds ice to the wire and makes it extra tough for feet that must be kept bare to ensure a good grip. This bair-raising trick is called the death pass performed halfway between two of Europe's highest peaks.

And now the Eugspitse troupe start their most difficult stunt. They've never perfermed under these conditions before and this is their first experiment. If they fail, they'll never learn where they went wrong.
