POTTERIES WELCOME PRINCIPSS,

To the Potteries - that smeky North Stafferdshire district famed for its china and immortalised by Arnold Bennett - comes Primess Elizabeth on a two-day tour - part of her ever-increasing programme of visiting the nation's industries. New-castle-under-lyme is smong her stopping places, but the high-light of her visit had come earlier at the Potteries at Burslem one of Bennett's "Five Towns." Here the Primess sees the working life of an industry that employs 48,000 people - 70 per cent of them women.

Buring her visit, the Primess learns much of the petterers' possiliar trades: Of fettlers, who make edges smooth, of speut-makers, cup-and-bewl makers, mould-runners and plate-makers: Of an industry, that supplies a record proportion of the world's purcelain and china and to-day ranks among Britain's biggest experters.

While the Petteries are geographically the dead centre of Bigland, materially, they are the pounding heart of a live and thriving industry - an industry that earns the admiration of the heiress-te-the-threns.
