In Monte Carle's Roman Cathedral, watched by the Diplomatic Corps, Prince Rainier the Third ascends the throne as supreme ruler of the 2,000 people of Monace - Europe's timiest state. From the Archbishop of Monace, the Prince (seated on a golden chair) receives neither crown, nor corenet, but the Church's Blessing.

Outside the Cathedral, contingents of French,
American and British blue jackets are paraded for this
ceremonial occasion. Presenting decorations to court
efficials is the first Royal duty for the newly-installed
monarch - the only absolute monarch left in Europe. The
people of Monaco are quite happy about it - for they are
also the only Europeans left who don't pay taxes. The
tourists who play - and lose - at the Casine, do it for them.
