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PRESIDENT LEADS IRELAND'S HOLY TEAR PILOPING

A four-engined airliner brings to Clampino airfield near Rome President Scan O'Kelly and his lady. Their arrival inaugurates the first Irish National Pilgrimage of the Hely Year. The President is the first head of a severeign state to make the jubiles pilgrimage in his official capacity. Representatives of Church and State are there to we loome him.

The Presidential party makes the 10-mile journey into Rome along the Appian Way. Their temporary home is the levely Villa Spada, where they are the guests of the Irish Ambassador to the Vatican. The day after his arrival sees the President leave by car for St. Peter's for an audience with the Pepe.

Passing Garibaldi's statue on the Gianicele, the President and Mrs. O'Kelly see the Eternal City at its best. Summer had come after weeks of autumn-like weather. Approaching St. Peter's, the President is met by the traditional Vatican ceremonial reserved for visiting Heads of State. A guard of hemour, made up of the Palatime Guard and Vatican gendarmerie, are drawn up for his inspection, as the Presidential cortege enters the precincts of St. Peter's.

Along the Noble Staircase, the Presidential party is conduced to the Papal apartment, where His Holiness receives them in private audience. Meanwhile, in St. Peter's Square, other pilgrims await their turn to pay their respects to the Hely Father.

The President, who told the Pape that he had come, as a pilgrim, to place his personal homage and that of the Irish people at the feet of the Holy Father, presented His Holiness with a chalice and, in turn, received a gold medal. Thus, with impressive corremony, ends the Presidenties first day of his jubilee Year Pilgrimage.
