Fiery streams of lava rush to the sea as Mauna Loa, the world's largest active volcano erupts after 18 months of quiet. The eruption of the 14-thousand-foot volcano, 200 miles from Honolulu, continues day and night, pouring out the greatest flow of lava seen this century, as five streams roll 20 miles to the sea. But there are no casualties to report: the islanders learned long ago to steer clear of Mauna Loa.
