

INDO-CHINAFRENCH COMMANDOS ROUND UP REBELS

Equipped with amphibious vehicles, a Franco-Vietnam commando force enters rebel territory to raid a Vietminh strong centre. Vietnam is the independent state set up by France, Vietminh the Communist organisation recognised by Russia.
