## HELGIUM SAYS "NO" TO LEOPOLD.

Called back by only a small majority, 10 days later Leopold III hands over power to his son, Frince Maskada, have seen following him. At the Lasken Palace the decision was taken. The King's return, on which the people veted, split Balgian. Whilst some velocated the return of the memorehy after long years of discussions and negotiations, there were others mearly as manerous who refused the memoreh himself. Led by former Franker Paul Spaak, they demonstrated and the rift was wide open. Striked broke out everywhere, threatening to bring Balgian to a standstill. Called back by the Government, the King was there by right, but an enflamed mob knows no right but its own. Grisis comes to a head as strikers begin rioting. In Francels they bring traffic to a step.

Isabelle Elum and other socialist leaders urge restraint but the mob's out of hand.
