From Windser Castle the Garter Enights march in procession. Pollowing Princess Elizabeth and the Buke is King Frederik, newly invested and now to be installed by the King. Mantled in blue, their Tuder hats declad with estrich and heren feathers, they go to St. Georges Chapel - Alanbrooks, Portal, Mounthatten. But in all there are no more than 25 (other than the Boyal family) in this our most exclusive order of chivalry. In St. Georges, chapel of the order, the King will appoint the new knight companion to a stall and his installation will be complete.

Next, at the Guildhall, King Prederik is to be henoured by the City of Lenden. Princess Elisabeth is with the Lord Mayer and Lady Mayeress and everhead flies the Danish flag, as King Frederik and Queen Ingrid arrive.

In the library of the Court of Common council, escerted by the senior aldermen, their Majesties move towards searlet thrones at the head of the hall, past the court of common council with their wands of office and robes of deep blue.

In the casket is the city's address of welcome, which the Lord Mayer will present to the King.
