## "METEOR" BEATS HEIGHT RECORD

At Moreton Valence, Glousester, test pilet Richard Prickett waits whilst a Royal Acro Club official fixes the mechanism which will start the camera that's to film the height seadings. The camera is put in position and when connections are made, the compartment is sealed, ready for Flight Lioutenant Prickett to attack the speed-of-climb record.

From a standing start the Sapphire jets - most powerful in the world - take the Moteor nearly seven-end-a-half miles high in a little over three minutes (nearly seven times as fast as the old Spitfires!), shattering four world records.
