MEETING OF BRITISH AND AMERICAN ACK-ACK CHIEFS

On Friday, 28th September, 1951, Lieut-General Sir Charles F. Loewen, K.B.E., C.B., D.S.O., General Officer Commanding-in-Chief, Anti-Aircraft Command, was visited at his Command HQ, Starmore, Middlesex, by Major-General Willard Wadsworth Irvine, Commanding General of the United States Army Anti-Aircraft Command, an appointment he has held since his Command was formed in 1950.

The meeting took place on the eve of Exercise Pinnacle, the largest R.A.F. air defence exercise since the war, in which AA Command and the 32nd U.S. AA Artillery Brigade, stationed in East Anglia, are among the formations engaged.

General Loewen

Before his appointment as GOC-in-C AA Command in May, 1950, was Commander of Northumbrian District, and the 50th (Northumbrian) Division (TA).

In May, 1944, took command of the 1st Infantry Division, then in the Anzio beach-head, and in 1946 appointed commander of the 6th Ammoured Division. General Loewen was knighted earlier this year.
