Barton-en-Sea

Caldon Low

To speed up output of limestone at the Derbyshire stone quarry, a cliff 150 feet high and nearly 400 feet leng is to be blown up. 22 tons of explosive will make this Britain's biggest blast. The bere goes 70 feet into the cliff. Flags mark the danger area. Hearly 280,000 tens will be out off. The last flag; and the siren sounds as they count off the seconds:-
