CHURCHILL TELLS U.S.

The sooner strong enough forces can be assembled in Europe under United command, the more effective will be the deterrent against a third World war. If I may say this, members of Congress, be careful above all things not to let go the atomic weapon until you are sure, and more than sure, that other means of preserving peace are in your hands."
