## ISIAILIA ABOY SELZE POLICE H.Q.

Centurien tunks, armoured cars of the Royal dragooms and men of the Lancashire Fusiliers prepare to attack Egyptian Police Headquarters. A surrender demand has been ignered and now fire opens up, as General Erskine takes stern measures in Ismailia. Many police of the auxiliary guard have taken part in terrerist activity and only complete British control can restere order.

One Headquarters building is on fire, and headed by tanks the Lancashires storm through a breached wall. In the battle, a British officer and twelve men are wounded, and three British soldiers killed. Again an offer of homourable surrender is ignered and fire intensifies, as the Egyptian Government order the police to regist. But now despite heavy fire, the Lancashires go in to storm the position.

Soen the prisoners come trailing out ... in all about 800, less than a hundred of them regular police. Untrained, undisciplined and easily agitated, these auxiliaries were a constant menace to our men and the people of Ismailia. Soon after, realising the harm that has been done, King Farouk dismissed his Cabinet.

In the three hour action, ferty-ems police were killed through what General Erskine called the lumscy of their superiors. A large supply of arms and assumition (more than any police force would need) proves the threat these men were to Ismailia; nearly 600 rifles, sub-machine guns and pistels, and a hundred thousand rounds. The action was drastio, but the need was great.
