DISASTERS AT SEA

At Pendeen, Cornwall, the Liberian earge-ship "Liberty" blases after three explosions. With 460 tens of coal in her bunkers, the ship looks doomed as firemen from Pensance, Falmouth and St. Just arrive to take a hand. Small pertable pumps are run enboard. When the "Liberty" ran aground in a gale, Patho showed dramatic exclusive resous pictures. Salvage operations were in hand when the fire broke out, and one theory is that an exygen cylinder expleded. As our pictures were being taken rescuers were in process of saving the ship's cat.

In the Atlantic off Cape God, the stern section of the tanker "Pendleton," (broken away from the bow in a furious stern) rells helplessly. Thirty-two men were rescued, one was drowned. Hine stayed onboard.

Pifteen miles away our Coast Guard plane skims over the bow section wrecked on a shoal. There were eight men on this part when the storm ripped the "Pendleton" apart ... new all eight are believed to be dead.

In the Atlantic off Cape God, the stern section of the tanker Pendleton, split from the bow in a furious storm, careens helplessly.
