Grosvener's Bridge and the Buke's get a comfortable lead of more than a minute but Evans, number 3, and McCandless are putting on the pressure.

There's quite a battle going on behind the Buke between his team-mates and their A.J.S. rivals.

It's a 264 mile course with plenty of twists and turns, but the Duke's been lapping at minety miles an hour and he's set a pace that no-one can rival.

Mear the finish it's still the Duke, and he crosses the line to win at a record-breaking average speed of over ninety miles per hour, even faster than his performance last year.
