

KOJE PRISONERS DEFI BRITISH

Red prisoners raise abusive banners in Koje Island compounds, in defiance of United Nations orders, even as British and Canadian troops are brought in to reinforce the garrison. Marine General Boatner, the new American camp commander, warns the British that the prisoners still do much as they please and continue to defy regulations by marching in a kind of Oriental goose-step, singing, shouting, and even engaging in bayonet-practise with makeshift wooden rifles. It may take several weeks before all the prisoners can be split into more manageable groups. Meanwhile, there have been fierce clashes in compound seventy-six between the Reds and their American guards, resulting in a heavy death-roll.
