INAUGURATION

President-elect Elsenhower and Mrs Elsenhower arrive in "ashington for the inuguration. Excited erowds hall the man who is to become America's thirty fourth president. A motoreade speeds the Elsenhowers to the Statler, where, with son John and his wife, they are to stay until they can move into the White Housey two days later. At National Presphyterian Church, early on the morning of the imaguration day, the Elsenhowers, followed by over a hundred members of their

official family, arrive for private services. The vice-president elect Richard Nixon and his wife are also present. Elsenhower prays for divine guidance. He has been given a copy of the New Testament by minister Elsen. The historic moment of the inauguration is fast approaching. Elsenhower's next major stop is at the White House, to plok up the President, Mr Truman, ending the last few minutes of his term, and Mrs Truman and Margaret, give the Eisenhovers a warm welcome to their new home. Mr Truman is now Cintabing Almost twenty years of public service in Washington, With Senator Bridges and Speaker of the House Martin, Ike and Mr Truman head for the Capitol behind a flying V of policemen. The Streets of Washington are filled

Beneath the great dome, America's thirty-fourth President is to take the oath of office before one hundred twenty five thousand persons. President-elect Eisenhover arrives and slowly makes his way out on the elaborate, specially-constructed inaugural platferm, where Mr. Mixon, President Truman and other distinguished guests are seated.

Every foot of space on Gapitol Plaza is jammed with spectators.

The thirty-nine-year-old Nixon, hand raised and solemm, is sworn in as Vice President. The dimax is near to one of the most impressive inaugural coremonies in America's one hundred and sixty four year

history.

A wave of excitement sweeps over the crowd, young and old, as the stewardship of the world's greatest democracy prepares to change

When the official ceremonies at the Capitol are completed, President and Mrs Elsenhower prepare to lead themak motorcade to the White House reviewing stand, escorted by eschelons of motorcycle police.

As the procession moves along historic Pennsylvania Avenue, the new president vigorous and smiling, waves heartily in acknowledgment to the cheers of thousand upon thousands of enthusiastic, wide-eyed citizens.

President Eisenhever, a veteran of many parades, leads the most important one of his life. At the White House grounds the entourage halts and the President and Vice President take their places on the reviewing stand. Before them pass the cadets of West Point marching in perfect eless-order formation. Thirty-eigh years ago, President Elsenhower, then a cadet at the Military Academy, marched with the West Point contingent in the parade at Woodrow Wilson's inaugural. Battle-elad infantrymen parade the colors of Army and Marine regiments that have fought in Korea. Seven hundred and fifty thousand spectators, including Jack L. Warner and his daughter Barbars, watch the awe-inspiring pageant which goes on for hours.
