The Boys' Clubs of
New York versus London
In a Trans-Atlantic Amateur Boxing Match
Sponsored by the Variety Club of Gt. Britain

A three-year dream comes true - a first time ever Trans-Atlantic Amateur Boxing Match between the Boys' Clubs of New York and London. A team of 17 boys from the Boys' Clubs of New York City will be flown on a special chartered B.O.A.C. Airliner to London, to box the champions of the London Federation of Boys' Clubs, at Empress Hall, on 8th April.

The New York boys whose ages range from 16 to 19, will depart on Friday, 3rd April and arrive at London Airport on Saturday, 4th April.

The long-awaited hope of this Trans-Atlantic Match became a reality when Pepsi-Cola offered to provide the air transportation which has made it possible for this match to take place. The Pepsi-Cola Companies of America and Great Britain made the generous offer, when they learned that the proceeds of the match would go to the London Federation of Boys' Clubs and the Variety Heart Fund for poor and needy children.

The 17 bouts will range from paper weight to middle weight. A special Challenge Trophy will be awarded to the winning team. It is hoped that a Trans-Atlantic Match will be come an annual event in alternative Countries.

The London Team will be selected following the Federation's Finals which will be held at the Royal Albert Hall in March. The New York boys are now having inter-club matches which will lead to the finals in February.

Special camps will be provided for each team and full training facilities will be available. Coaches of both teams have agreed that "strict training schedules will be adhered to prior to the match"



SCULPTOR VASCO LAZZOLO USES LONDON BOY AS MODEL FOR "THE EDINBURGH TROPHY-INTERNATIONAL BOYS' CLUBS BOXING".

British Sculptor Vasco Lazzolo who recently completed a bust in bronze of The Duke of Edinburgh (it was Lazzolo's first Royal Commission) will execute in bronze "The Edinburgh Trophy-International Boys' Clubs Boxing" which will be awarded to the winning team of the Trans-Atlantic Boys' Amateur Boxing Match between New York and London. Sponsored by the Variety Club the Match will take place at London's Empress Hall on 8th April (7.45 p.m) in the presence of The Duke of Edinburgh.

The presentation of the "Edinburgh Trophy" to the winning team will be made by The Duke in the ring at the conclusion of the Match.

Named after the Duke of Edinburgh the Trophy was donated by His Royal Highness as his contribution to the event. The Duke is patron of the London Federation of Boys' Clubs and a life-long member of variety Club. As it is hoped that the Trans-Atlantic Match will alternate annually between New York and London, "The Edinburgh Trophy" will be used each year.

The Model, Leslie Steers from Camberwell, age 17, a sheet metal worker chosen from among fifty club boys, was National Junior ABA Winner last year.

Commenting on the design of "The Edinburgh Trophy", Lazzolo stated:
"I shall give it individuality and that is why I selected a typical
Boys' Club boxer as model. The trophy will personify a boxing boy -that is, head, shoulders and chest, arms' crossed with boxing gloves on
each hand -- all in bronze."

Lezzolo will be putting the finishing touches on the clay model while Leslie Steers poses on


