

The Town of Dumfries is conferring upon the K.O.S.Bs the freedom to enter the Town on Ceremonial Occasions with Bayonets fixed, Drums beating and Colours Flying. This event will take place on the 7th March, 1953 in the forencon, H.R.S. the Duchess of Gloucester as Colonel in Chief will attend to receive the Screll. The proceedings will take place in the open air and the K.OlS.Bs are sending detachments from four or five of their battalions. There is also to be in attendance some ten neighbouring Provosts and altogether the event which can never happen again should be a colourful occasion. THE FREEDOM OF ENTRY INTO THE ROYAL BURGH OF DUMFRIES ON CEREMONIAL OCCASIONS WITH BAYONETS FIXED; DRUMS BEATING AND COLOURS FLYING. SATURDAY, 7th MARCH 1953. 10.00-10.15 Bells of the Midsteeple ring our. 10.15-10.40 Band and Pipes of the K.O.S.B. will play at the Whitesands. Her Royal Highness, accompanied by the Lord Lieutenant 10.30 a.m. of Dumfriesshire and Mrs. Crabbe, and the Lady in (approx.) Waiting, leave DUNCOW HOUSE in 2 cars provided by the Town Council. 10.45 a.m. Her Royal Highness arrives at the WHITESANDS at the top or north barrier of the Parade Ground. When Her Royal Highness alights from her car, the Lord Lieutenant will present the PROVOST, Provost Bell. The COLONEL OF THE REGIMENT will await Her Royal Highness at the same place, unless desired to report earlier. Her Royal Highness, on entering the Parade Ground, will be received with a ROYAL SALUTE, all Colours will be dipped and the Regimental Band will play the NATIONAL ANTHEM. The COLONEL OF THE REGIMENT will present the Officer Commanding the Parade, Major G.M. DINWIDDIE. Highness, accompanied by the LORD LIEUTENANT, Her Royal Highness, accompanied by the LORD LIEUTENANT, the PROVOST and the COLONEL OF THE REGIMENT, will then inspect the GUARD OF HONOUR, supplied by the 5th (Dumfries and Galloway) Battalion, The King's Own Scottish Borderers. The Parade will then "SLOPE ARMS". Then the Provost will call for "THREE CHEERS for THE KING'S OWN SCOTTISH BORDERERS."

11.45 a.m. (approx.)

Her Royal Highness will leave the DAIS and be conducted to her car. When Her Royal Highness reaches the north or top barrier, the Officer Commanding the Parade will order a ROYAL SALUTE, All Colours will be dipped and the Regimental Band will play the NATIONAL ANTHEM.

Her Royal Highness, accompanied by the Lady in Waiting, the Lord Lieutenant, the Provost and the Colonel of the Regiment, and possibly other ladies present, will proceed in 4 cars to the Municipal Chambers where the PROVOST will conduct Her Royal Highness to the Reception Room to await the arrival of the Town Council and other guests at the Saluting Base.

Her Royal Highness will be donducted to the Saluting Base for the MARCH PAST by THE KING'S OWN SCOTTISH BORDERERS in the following order of march:-

1.30 p.m.


Her Royal Highness will be entertained to LUNCH, at the Station Hotel, by the PROVOST.
