

REDS PROTEST AT BONN TREATY

In Bonn, Chancellor Adenauer addresses the German Federal Bundestag on the question of ratifying the European Army Treaty. Communists outside the building show their disagreement of any such ratification, and police are forced to turn powerful fire hoses on the demonstrators.

Many of the Communists try desperately to continue the demonstration, but quickly police deal with the situation. Meanwhile, the debate continues. Herr Ollenhauer leads the opposition in fighting the Treaty which proposes European military integration and the end of the Occupational Statute for Western Germany. The debate ends, and the motion is put to the vote. The house is divided, but a clear majority is in favour. They are the first European body to ratify the treaty. As the decision is announced, guards ensure that all is kept quiet in Bonn.
