Hutton and Freddy Brown decide to take the new ball. Bedser again to Harvey.

And he's got him! LoB.W. bowled Bedser for 59. Australia are now 190 for two. But Lindsay Hassett smacks this one hard and there's his hundred. That's his fourth century against England and his tenth in test cricket. But a pulled leg muscle finally forces him to leave the field. Bad luck indeed after a really magnificent innings. The man who takes his place is Graham Hole, a free scoring right hander.
