EVEREST CONQUERCES IN DELHI

Colonel John Hunt and his party arrive at Delhi. In his hand is the ice-axe which Hillary and Tensing used on the last hap of their conquest of Everest. Five thousand Indians clamour round the aircraft togatch a glimpse of the two whe feached the summit: New Zealander Edmund Hillary and Sherpa Tensing. Pressmen struggle with the crowds who have broken through the pelice corden, as the members of the expedition make towards their ear.

As the car begins its journey, treeps attempt to clear a way through the throng. More huge crowls gather for a ceremony hold by the Dolhi Corporation. Hillary, Hunt and Tensing are the guests of henour. Tensing, one of the most expert of all the Sherpa guides, watches the Corporation's President present Colonel Hunt with a silver model of Asheka's piller, insignia of the Indian Government. Mrs. Tensing looks on proudly as her husband receives a silver replice of Mount Everest.

Hillery, tee, receives a model of the mountain he conquered. It was on Coronation Day that first we heard of the expedition's triumph. Since that time we have learned with ever-growing admiration how great was their struggle to achieve their goal. On returning to Britain they will receive from the Que on the hencurs they have so richly deserved.
