

SCOTLAND VS. ALL BLACKS.

Fifteen of the All Blacks best players get set at Murrayfield where more than 40,000 fans have gathered to watch their battle with Scotland. Right from the word "Go" its almost impossible to tell who's who on the field - they're darn nearly All black. A slippery, slidy mat-pie of a pitch doesn't allow exactly copy-book rugby, but the thrills are there just the same.

There's nothing on the scoreboard at half-time. Despite critics who say this match will be a walk over for the New Zealanders; the Scots give as good as they get.

From the scrum-down, Scotland get it, but a fumble along the line ends their hopes of a rush attack.

The ball goes loose and a Scotsman - finds touch the hard way.

Dixon throws in for the All Blacks. The visitors (the heavier and more powerful team) snatch it out of the tussle, and as cool as they come, gain a few yards with a kick for touch. Ten minutes after half-time, a penalty gives the All Blacks a chance of scoring. Bob Scott takes it.

New Zealand, three points in the lead, are full of confidence now. But Scotsmen always fight best when things are against them. A new cap, MacLachlan, gets it, but Peter Jones halts his attack. Towards the end of the second half, there's another anxious moment for Scotland as the All Blacks drive for the corner, with Haig leading the rush. But he touches down just short of the line, and New Zealand with a narrow win by three points to nil, add Scotland to their list of victories.
