QUEEN IN CANBERRA.

Her Majesty the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh visit the great Australian National War Memorial which looks down upon Canberra, capital of the Commonwealth. Hundreds of ex-servicemen and relatives of the fallen watch the royal visitors enter the forecourt of the massive building wherein is contained a museum and an art gallery.

Together Her Majesty and her husband pay tribute to the dead of two world wars.

In the land for which they fought and died, the Queen leads the nation in remembering Australia's glorious dead.

A soaring column stands close by - a symbol of Australia's gratitude to the Americans who died during the war in the Pacific. Her Majesty is to unveil this memorial, which was purchased with gifts from the people of Australia. Beneath the 285 feet high column, surmounted by an American eagle, the short ceremony is conducted.

Now follows the unveiling of a bronze plaque by Her Majesty.

The firm links between America and the British Commonwealth, forged so strongly in the heat of battle, are strengthened yet more by this royal homage.
