Their training base is at a lonely military airport at Briancon, where expert ground staff keep the machines in tip-top condition before they face the hazards of wind and snow.

Variable mountain winds are 'copters pilot's biggest headaches. A bird's eye view of Fort Gondrand shows the fortifications built by the Italians during the war. Heavy gums used to sheel Briancon from here. Gently the aircraft is brought in to land on the summit of Gondrand Peak, which stands about 8,500 feet high.
