In the crowded Senate eaucus room, the McCarthy-Army dispute reaches a showdown. Army Secretary Stevens insists SeCarthy used improper pressure on the Pentagon. The Wiseonsin Senator, arriving with his wife, sticks to his charge that the Army blackmail to halt his probe of "Communist coddling."

Briefcases bulging with documents relating to the charges are entered in evidence as Mr. Stevens bolsters his charges and McCarthy and Roy Cohn — accused in of threatening to wreck the Army — strike back.

Ray Jenkans acts as counsel, Senator Mundt as chairman during the hearings, which attract an overflow crows.
