SPORTS NEWS:

AINTREE:

Its umbrella weather at Aintree for the first car-race meeting on the new £100,000 track. Many European aces compete in the international scratch race for Formula Libre cars, sponsored by the Daily Telegraph. Peter Collins, in his Ferrari thin-wall special soon takes the lead, with Sterling Moss in a Maserati not far away.

A.R.M., with Ken Wharfen at the wheel, is going well despite the slippery surface. A rival, Ken Flint skids off the track in his K.R.A., but it is soon back in the race.

The thin-wall special has plug trouble and, later, Peter Collins is forced to retire. That leaves Stirling Moss out in front.

And Moss flashes past to win. Watched by Mrs. Mirabelle Topham, the Lord Mayor of Liverpool hands the victory trophy to the 24 year old British ace.

MUIRFIELD:

In the Amateur Golf Championships American Bill Campbell finishes the morning's play one up in his tussle with Australia's Douglas Bachli. But from that moment on, it's Bachli all the way. Here's a typical putt.

On the last green now, and Bachli coolly and confidently puts the ball straight down the hatch. A magnificent, sporting contest between the American and the Aussie. It's the first time in golfing history that an Australian has won the championship.

PARIS:

Paris, where Emil Zatopek, in the inside lane, is matched against an international field in the 5,000 metres. The Czech is quickly in the lead and clocking good time. Zatopek, who flew into Paris only hours before the race, was barred entry into France for a time, following protests about an unflattering article he wrote after a previous visit to Paris. He's a lap ahead and still going well. 13 minutes, 57.2 seconds is Zatopek's time, a new world record to add to the other eight he already holds.
