Command Permanent Range, Weybourne, Norfolk, on Friday 13 August, 1954. Piring will be scheduled at 10.30 a.m. and again at 2 p.m., subject to suitable weather conditions. I will be very pleased if you will also be our guest fat lunch.

Weybourne is situated 3 miles north of Sheringham and is on the coast. A British Army officials who have been invited to attend the practice firing include General Sir Maurice S. Chilton, GOC in C of the British AA Command, Major General Fanshawe, GOC, 1st AA Group, Major General Tapp, GOC, 2nd AA Group, Brigadier Chaytor, Commander, 16 AA Brigade and Air Commodore Widdows, Sector Commander, Eastern Sector.

The 39th AAA Battalion of the Brigade is presently carrying out its "Skysweeper" conversion firing. It is the first unit in Europe to be equipped with the new weapon. Their firing during this period will therefore be confined to familiarization with the equipment and the more simple engagement of both radio controlled and towed targets.
