EUTLIN'S INTERNATIONAL CROSS CHANNEL SWIMMING RACE. 13 COUNTRIES TO BE REPRESENTED.

18 entries from all over the world have been accepted for Butlin's International Cross Channel Swimming Race organised by Billy Butlin and the International Long Distance Swimming Federation. The swimmers, five women and thirteen men, are the representatives of 13 countries: Gt. Britain, France, Denmark, Portugal, Italy, Greece, Argentina, Mexico, U.S.A., Malta, Lebonan, Syria and Egypt, and they will compete for prize money amounting to £1,900 and the Butlin Silver Cup, value 1,000 guineas.

The race is due to take place, weather permitting, on Sunday, August 22nd, and the swimmers will enter the water at Cap Gris Nez in a mass start shortly before 2.a.m.

A limited amount of accommodation for reporters and photographers will be available aboard a 75 ton motor yacht, the control vessel for the race, which will be specially equipped with radar for plotting the position of swimmers and V.H.F. radio for relaying press messages to the English shore. In addition, a few places will be available in the marshalling boat and pilot launches. (1)
