## BOCK STRIKE HODS:

Back into the Pert of Lenden stream dockers and stovedores ' who have been an strike for 26 days. As they do so, dockers in seven other perts who struck in sympathy, are also returning. During the stoppage, our cameranan flow over Lenden's dockland. Dolow were some of the 340 ships hept idle by the strike of more than \$3,000 dock-workers. Experts and imports - about two million pounds worth - were hold up.

Even as work begins, comes a new threat. Here than 2,000 men stage a strike almost immediately. The dispute arises when many dechers refuse to handle leads for lerries driven by men-union men or these whe worked during the original strike. Quickly more dockers come out in sympathy and soon work has consed on eleven ships in the Peel of London. Two more in the Surre y and Commericial and London Docks are afforted. Heanwhile the vest majority of the dockers continue to work the loaded freighters. The earlier strike, which was over the question of voluntery overtime, is estimated to have cost the mation about fifty million pounds. Now an even higher bill seems likely, when this new strike is halted at ence.
