BOXING - ENGLAND DRAW WITH GERMANY:

The long and the short of it meet at Wembley. In this case the long is Britain's Bruce Wells, and the short Germany's Hans Reinhardt, a southpaw. The fight is part of the amateur boxing international between the two countries. Wells, who tops his opponent by about ten inches, has the advantage of reach, but Reinhardt throws a left that sends him down.

Off they go again, with the German ripping through the British boy's defences. Wells, who's won all but three of his 271 fights, is in real trouble. Reinhardt's sledgehammer left keeps getting to the target, and Wells can't find an answer.

A box on the ears for the German who has ready drawn blood, from Well's nose. In he comes again out for the kill this time.

With the German's head tucked underneath his arm, Wells shakes his own. He's pretty dazed. With four of the other fights going in Germany's favour, and five in Britain's, Reinhardt makes the match a 5 all draw and without the use of a step-ladder.
