Rescue squade hurrhodly go to work to free passengers still trapped in the wreekage of a train which grashed at Leuvain, twenty miles from Brussels. The majority of the 700 people absard were German soccer fans returning home from the Wenbley match. About sixty were serieusly injured, and it is now learned that the death-roll stands at twenty. Three eeaches, the engine and its tender toppled down the embrankment. The second ceach was samahed like a matchbez. The engine driver and fireman are among the dead.

The tangled mass of wreakage takey resous workers for many hours from reaching all those who are trapped. But finally the last of the injured is brought from the grashed coaches. It is feared that the death-roll may be yet higher, for there is little hope for some of the grisvously injured.
