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## SUFFON COLUPTED PAIL MESASTER.

By the light of flares and floodlams, resous workers search amongst the wreckage of the York to Bristel Express which grashed at Sutton Coldfield, 7 miles North East of Birminghen, As the train entered Sutten Coldfield station, the engine left the rails, everturning six of the ten opaches.

First aid squads stand by. Hurse Gellion (on the right) has been here for fifteen hours. Relief workers began their tasks at once. The W.V.S. where there throughout the night. A pilot driver was on the footplate at the time of the crash, for the train has been diverted. He and the fireman were killed, but the normal driver escaped with injuries. As dawn breaks, work still goes on. The engine, which had crashed into the station platform, blocked the line, and it was due to a Railway Fireman who was travelling on the thain that an even worse tragedy was averted. He ran to a signal box and gave the danger signal that halted another express approaching from the South.

It is significent that the all-stell coaches of the train were not so seriously damaged as those constructed of wood. There were no deaths in the steel coaches. The engine has been removed by grane so that rescuers may continue their searching. Since these pictures were taken, it is known that about 25 people have been seriously injured and that the deathrell stands at 17. It is feared that several more hedies are yet to be discovered.
