NEWS FLASHES.

Colonel Nasser, the steel-fisted Prime Minister of Egypt, boards Marshal Tito's ship "Galeb" at Suez for a private meeting with the President of Yugoslavia. It was in this same vessel that the Communist Marshal journeyed to Britain two years ago. Colonel Nasser, who now seems secure in the role once played by General Nogiub, obviously welcomes the chance of personal talks with Tito. The Marshal allows pressmen into his luxurious cabin where preliminary talks are held. Tito, who has been on a visit to India, is now on his way home to Yugoslavia.

Mrs. Nettie Moulden celebrates her hundredth birthday with a visit to the President in the White House. Ike adds his signature to her book which contains the autograph of Abraham Lincoln. Mrs. Moulden was nine years old when Lincoln signed for her. "Happy Birthday" writes President Eisenhower to the grand old lady.

Movable jet engines fixed to a new experimental plane give the American answer to our own "Flying Bedstead". Test pilot Dave Howe shows how the aircraft works. The jets give a downward thrust, just like the Bedstead, and up goes the 'plane vertically. By turning the jets to the horizontal position, the 'plane can go forward at speed - but there's something we're not allowed to film. A compressed air system, ejecting air streams at the tail and wing-tips, gives the pilot complete control. The 'plane has been described by its makers, as "the greatest single development since the Wright Brother's first flying machine".
