

PRINCESS TOURS ANTIGUA.

Princess Margaret is escorted by Sir Kenneth Blackburne, the Governor of the Leeward Islands, when she attends a garden party held in her honour. This takes place on the island of Antigua, one of the Leeward group to which Her Royal Highness journeyed from Barbados in the royal yacht Britannia.

And then it is the children's moment. At Savannah, the Princess drives past more than 6,000 boys and girls, most of whom wear the uniform of a Girl Guide or Scout. It is here that some of the island's major cricket matches are held, in the eyes of the spectators is reflected the feeling of these people towards the Royal Tour.

A quaint railway engine (rather like an invention of cartoonist Emmett,) attracts Her Royal Highness when she stops during a drive through a sugar plantation. Then she moves on to English Harbour, when Lord Nelson lived for two years. Giant capstans, once used to careen men-of-war when they were due for retarring, have been preserved. English Harbour was for more than 150 years, a vital base for ships of the Royal Navy guarding the islands in the Caribbean.
