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Bvery year, official parades and unofficial festivities make Is Quaterno Juillot the day of all days. And this year the French expital combines splendour and gainty as successfully as over.

The long summer day has ended, but the festivities have only just began. The Fourteenth of July will have been the Fifteenth for many hours before anyone thinks of sloop.

And while we're in France, let's pay a visit to a new building which has caused much discussion - the church of Notre Dame du Haut - (Our lady of the Hilliop) in the Verges Mountains. It is the first church to be built by Le Cerbusier, the Franch architect whose revolutionary designs have made him world-Causus.

Romehamps is a traditional place of pilgrimage, and the new church is built on the site of one destroyed during the liberation battles of 1944. And whatever you may think of the church - the pilgrims still come.
